Our commitments

Environment

- Favor local suppliers when offers are equivalent
- Favor suppliers with an active CSR approach when the offers are equivalent
- Periodically consult our suppliers on their CSR commitment
- Avoid purchasing hazardous or harmful materials when possible

Social and Human Rights

- Refuse to list suppliers who do not respect human rights
- Refuse to list suppliers who practice forced labor and tolerate child labor
- Ensuring our suppliers meet the highest standards of occupational health and safety
- Work with partners who respect equal opportunities and prohibit all discrimination

Business ethics

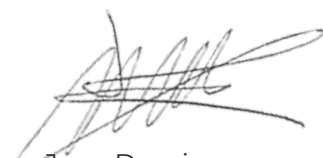
- Consult several suppliers when possible, in order to maintain healthy competition

Our goals for 2025

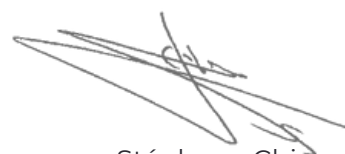
- Send out a questionnaire to assess the level of commitment of our suppliers
